The Power Of H²O

²¹ When all the people were being baptized, Jesus was baptized too. And as he was praying, heaven was opened ²² and the Holy Spirit descended on him in bodily form like a dove. And a voice came from heaven: "You are my Son, whom I love; with you I am well pleased." - Luke 3:21-22

The power of water is amazing, and a little or a lot of it can go a long way. With all the storms we have been having over the last month, many of us have had a fresh reminder of what can happen when the heavens are opened and water bursts forth with torrential power. It can clean, it can kill, and it can make alive I a host of ways.

I hope you will spend some time the next month to meditate on your own baptism and the power of heaven to open in your life and the lives around you. Just think of all the people to who the Spirit has revealed Christ and who have now been baptized into an eternal relationship with Him, and you are one of them!

I wonder. What kinds of places might the power of the Holy Spirit be moving even now, so that even more people might have the heavens opened up to them? Might there be places where the Spirit wants to use you to reveal Christ to others? Who knows, we might just have to start going to the beach more often!


COMPASS EDUCATION PROGRAM

THOUGHTS FROM THE DEACONESS

"I bind unto myself today The strong name of the Trinity By invocation of the same, The Three in One and One in Three," attr. St. Patrick, c. 372-466

Orthodox Jewish men, older than 13, will tie onto their foreheads and left arms small leather boxes, known as phylacteries. Each box contains slips of paper inscribed with a scripture passage. They wear these boxes during morning and afternoon prayers. This practice comes from Deut. 11:18 and is taken as a way to remind themselves and others of the importance of God's words.

In the baptism section of Lutheran Book of Worship (the green book), hymn #188, "I Bind unto Myself To-day", speaks of binding to ourselves the name of the Trinity. In the hymn, we don't ask the Trinity to bind itself to us. We say that we will bind the Trinity to ourselves. Instead of wearing boxes on our arms, we, by faith, tie the Trinity around us. What an intriguing image! To have the three persons of the Trinity wrapped around us like a belt or a cape. And not only does the hymn talk about being wrapped with God, it also speaks to binding God's creation to ourselves.

How differently would we live our lives if others saw us wrapped in the Trinity and creation? When we put on a favorite article of clothing or something brand new, do we act differently? If we are comfortable in our clothing, do we relate to others in a more relaxed manner? Would binding the Trinity over our hearts make us more loving and more sensitive to others? Would we hear their pain sooner and desire to help? If creation was tied around our waist, would we care more for the environment and the non-human creatures?

Binding the Trinity to ourselves is similar to what happened in our baptism. The cross of Christ was "marked" on our forehead and chest. This is to remind us as to whose we are and the cost to Christ for making us his own.

Martin Luther asks that all baptized Christians should daily remember their baptism, the washing away of sin, and the cross marked on us. May we begin each day remembering that mark and then binding ourselves with the Creator, Redeemer and Sanctifier.

Of whom all nature has creation, Eternal Father, Spirit, Word.

Praise to the Lord of my salvation;

Salvation is of Christ the Lord!


