THOUGHTS FROM THE DEACONESS

"Give thanks to God, bless his name."

Psalm 100:4b

Mary was born when I was ten months old. Her dad was the superintendent at the first Lutheran High School (1951) in Los Angeles. My dad joined the faculty in 1954. Mary and I became friends at a very early age. There were Saturdays together, sleep overs, Barbies, birthdays, trips to the beach (courtesy of Mary's older sister). High school came and Mary was gone for a year and I moved to Illinois and we lost touch. But our parents, especially our moms, didn't. I also happen to think that God kept a string connected between our two hearts, knowing that we would need each other again. For you see, in the bizarre way that life happens, Mary also has Multiple Sclerosis. She has battled this disease about twenty years, along with other health issues and surgeries.

We reconnected over fifteen years ago and stay in contact by phone and email. Sometimes our conversations don't even mention the MS, while other times that is the only topic. In a call right after Easter, I got the details of Mary's unexpected three day stay in the hospital and the update for her May 10 surgery. I had been in a funk over a number of things — health included. In light of her hospital stay and the upcoming surgery, I asked if she ever wanted to just give up. Not suicide — but to stop the doctor appointments and blood tests and out-patient therapy, etc., etc. Living with a disease for which there is no cure and there still is no knowledge of what causes it, I wondered how she goes on. "Becky", she said, "lean on God and find one thing each day for which to be thankful."

Her last words reminded me of Psalm 100 and St Paul's words in 1 Thessalonians. Both remind us to be thankful – and to direct that thankfulness to God. Neither text tells us to be thankful for the yucky stuff that happens. Paul clearly says to be thankful "in" all things, but not "for" all things. While God can and does use the yuck of life to draw us into a completely dependent relationship with God, we aren't called to celebrate when the difficult things of life occur. Instead, we are called to lean on God and be thankful for something. And if we just can't find that something, recite over and over again, "Thank you God for loving me."

"Rejoice always, pray without ceasing, give thanks in all circumstances; for this is the will of God in Christ Jesus for you."

1 Thessalonians 5:16-18
