Hebrews 12:1-3 Therefore, since we are surrounded by such a great cloud of witnesses, let us throw off everything that hinders and the sin that so easily entangles, and let us run with perseverance the race marked out for us. ² Let us fix our eyes on Jesus, the author and perfecter of our faith, who for the joy that was set before him endured the cross, scorning its shame, and sat down at the right hand of the throne of God. ³ Consider him who endured such opposition from men, so that you will not grow weary and lose heart.

In fact, I encourage all of you to make an intentional effort to pray for the meeting on January 24th from the time it begins at 10:00 until it ends at 3:00. Also continue to pray that as we move forward as a church, that we will always fix our eyes on Jesus and seek to glorify Him both as a church and individually. Even so Lord, Amen.

THOUGHTS FROM THE DEACONESS

"The Church exists..."

A dear friend of mine was diagnosed years ago as bipolar. Her life since the mid 70's has included an attempted suicide, three stays in the state hospital, isolation from her siblings, living on disability, numerous doctors and therapists and case managers, a never-ending list of drugs and injections, cancer – and the list goes on. We phone and write regularly. Even though it is long distance, I am honored to be part of her care team. She currently lives in HUD housing, with most of the renters being ten to twenty years older than she. In a recent phone call, she was concerned that she wasn't living as God intended. She wondered if God needed her and if she had any purpose. The immediate thought was whether she was suicidal. But that wasn't the issue. God is the center of her life and she really wondered if she was doing the work of the kingdom.

As the phone call continued, we talked of Frank. He regularly feasts on homemade soup and chili because of her. Teddi receives help almost every evening with her anti-embolism stockings. Pat and Anne hear the phone ring several times a week. Mail is picked up and delivered to people's doors. The Cancer Center has a regular volunteer helper and fresh flowers in vases during the summer. Because of her, many see and hear of the love of God.

If they are not doing that, all the cathedrals, clergy, missions, sermons, even the Bible itself, are simply a waste of time. God became Man for no other purpose. 
HELPING OUR FOOD PANTRIES
