The theme for this year's spiritual Growth Campaign is Bearing Fruit for Jesus. Once again we will be seeking to learn and grow together by all using the same material during the following:

- A **3 week sermon series**—Sundays, September 16-30.
- **Small group bible studies**—All members are encouraged to join a group for these 3 bible study sessions. Groups will meet at a variety of times during the week, including bible study hour on Sunday.)
- **Daily devotions**—these devotions will be handed out on Sept. 9 for use starting the week prior to the first sermon in the series.

The following is an introduction to what God's Word says about bearing fruit

Jesus said: "A bide in Me, and I in you. As the branch cannot bear fruit of itself, unless it abides in the vine, so neither can you, unless you abide in Me. I am the vine, you are the branches, he who abides in Me, and I in him, he bears much fruit, for apart from Me you can do nothing". (John 15: 4-5). Fruit characterizes the life of the Christian steward. It is interesting to note that, in this passage above, Jesus did not say, "You should bear fruit". He stated that when we abide in Him, it follows naturally that we will bear fruit.

Paul explained to the Galatians what that fruit is: "The fruit of the Spirit is love, joy, peace, patience, kindness, goodness, gentleness, faithfulness, and self-control." "Since we live by the Spirit," Paul exhorted, "let us keep in step with the Spirit. Let us not become conceited, provoking and envying each other" (Galatians 5:25-26). As children of God, we have this fruit because His Spirit lives in us. We do not bear fruit as a result of our own efforts, but we do cease to bear fruit when we give in to our sinful natures, becoming, in Paul's words, "conceited, provoking and envying each other".

Just as fruit needs light for its growth and maturation, so do Christians need to have their lives illumined by Christ. They then are able to produce spiritual fruit and shed that light on the world around them. Ephesians 5:11 cautions us to, "Have nothing to do with the fruitless deeds of darkness" but to "Live as children of light (for the fruit of the light consists in all goodness, righteousness and truth) and find out what pleases the Lord" (Ephesians 5:8-9).

We discover God's will through His word and through prayer. As Paul prayed for the Colossians, we, too, can ask God "to fill [us] with the knowledge of His will through all spiritual wisdom and understanding... in order that [we] may live a life worthy of the Lord and may please Him in every way: bearing fruit in every good work..." (Colossians 1:9-10).

God has plans and uses for our lives. When we abide in Christ, we will be fruitful. We will discover and follow His plan, and we will use the gifts He has given us in ministry to the people of the world. I hope you will all join us during this spiritual growth campaign as we seek to grow together in our relationship to Christ and in the fruitfulness that comes through Him.

THOUGHTS FROM THE DEACONESS

"Will we join in the Pentecost dance?"

Scattered throughout the book of Acts are bits and pieces of a marvelous story of a man named Barnabas. We first read of him in Acts 4:36-37 as he contributes money for the use of the apostles in Jerusalem. It is there that the meaning of his name is revealed – Son of encouragement. As time passes, he becomes more heavily involved in the work of the kingdom and eventually joins with Paul on his first missionary journey. A young man, John Mark, who we think is a kinsman of Barnabas, also joins the group. But part way through the trip, John Mark leaves, or possibly, deserts the group and returns to Jerusalem. The author of Acts never tells why.

But the repercussions of John Mark's departure are the most fascinating part of the story of Barnabas. For at the beginning of Paul's second missionary journey, he and Barnabas have a major disagreement over John Mark. Paul wants nothing to do with the young man, but Barnabas wants to give John Mark another chance. As Acts 15:38 records, "And there arose a sharp contention, so that they separated from each other; Barnabas took Mark . . .but Paul chose Silas."

However, the story doesn't end here. As Paul spends the last months of his life in a Roman prison, he writes to Timothy out of extreme loneliness and despair, "Get Mark and bring him with you; for he is very useful in serving me."

We have no hint as to what happened with Barnabas and John Mark in those intervening years. In fact there are only a few other references to Barnabas in the scriptures. But this son of encouragement, by his belief that Mark could grow in the faith, gifts Paul with someone who could stand with him during his time in prison.

How many of us can say that we have a Barnabas in our lives? Do we have someone who will give us another chance to redeem ourselves when we have failed? Do we have someone who will look past our faults and see the child of God that we are? Do we have someone who will even defy the views of others concerning us and reach out to encourage us?

Or even more important, how many of us can say that we are Barnabas to someone else?
